The goal of the **Beautiful Redemption Program** is to partner with local churches through the CarePortal.Org website to meet the needs of kids and families in crisis in our area.

How it Works:

- 1.) A child or family in our area needs help.
- 2.) A child-serving professional vets and types needs into the **Careportal.Org** website.
- 3.) The CarePortal.Org website alerts churches of needs.
- 4.) Churches virtually "raise their hand" to take on a specific need posted on the website that they decide they have the capacity to handle.
- 5.) The child and family are helped!

Ask Yourself: Is this something COB is called to join? Am I called to assist with a small team of others to coordinate this effort for our community?


